Mandatory Medical Clearance Guide

Please use this checklist as a guideline for submitting all the health forms needed to remove your medical hold. **Failure to complete all items will cause a delay in your ability to register for classes.**

ALL students (regardless of age) are required to complete the Med+Proctor Tuberculosis (TB) screening form. Moreover, in accordance with D.C. Law 3-20, students under the age of 26 by July 1st (Fall Semester) and December 1st (Spring Semester) must provide documentation of vaccination or immunity for Hepatitis B, Diphtheria, Tetanus, Pertussis, Measles, Mumps, Rubella and Varicella.

Register and submit your information to Med+Proctor using the checklist below. You must use the Med+Proctor immunization certificate, and all items must be received to lift your hold.

Mandatory Pre-admission Health Requirements

- ✓ **MED+PROCTOR** Tuberculosis screening form. If you answer **"YES"** to any of the screening questions, you are **REQUIRED** to complete a Tuberculosis PPD Skin test or Blood test
- ✓ Make sure your healthcare provider prints their name, signature, date of signature, and includes their NPI number on your **MED+PROCTOR Immunization Certificate**
- ✓ Required vaccines include MMR, Meningococcal, Hepatitis B, Varicella, Tdap, COVID-19 with booster (details provided when you log on to **MED+PROCTOR**)
- ✓ If you do not have access to your immunization history, you are **REQUIRED** to submit Measles, Mumps, Rubella, Varicella & Hepatitis B titer lab work to show immunity. ****Proof of Tdap, Meningitis & COVID-19 Vaccinations are also required****
- ✓ Meningococcal vaccination should be 1 dose at age **16 or older**
- ✓ Your major **MUST** match with the University record. Please select Health Science or Non-Health Science

Fall First Year Priority Deadline: June 1 

Final Fall Deadline: July 1 

Only students who have cleared their medical hold by the priority deadline will be eligible to register for classes during #BisonPrep (summer orientation)

Are You A Health Science Student?

Yes, if your program is within the College of Nursing & Allied Health Sciences, College of Medicine, College of Dentistry, or the School of Pharmacy. Biology majors are NOT Health Science students.

- In addition to the above checklist, review the extra requirements pertinent to your entry:
- Official lab results documenting immunity to MMR, Hepatitis B, and Varicella.
 - Be sure you have been screened for tuberculosis correctly! You are required to have a 2-step PPD (2 skin tests within 7-21 days) or a screening blood test.
