5. As you leave the Mordecai Wyatt Johnson Administration building, take a left on 6th street to approach the School of Business. With your back to the School of Business, what is the name of the building directly behind the Freedmen's Column Statue? (Hint: The answer can be found on the building.)

6. Continue walking up 6th street to the right until you arrive at the corner of 6th and Fairmont. On this corner is a residence hall which hosts male freshman students. What is the name of this residence hall?

7. If you look to the right while facing George W. Cook Hall, you will see Greene Stadium where Howard hosts its football, soccer, and lacrosse games. There is a word in each endzone, list both words.

8. As you continue to walk up 6th street, you will approach Burr Gymnasium. What year was Burr Gymnasium build. (Hint: The date is on the building.)



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9. Once at Burr, walk back towards Greene Stadium and pass Cramton Auditorium. As you continue past Cramton Auditorium, you will see a big statue. This statue was dedicated to former President James E. Cheeks and the First Lady of Howard University. What is the name of the statue?

10. This African American actor captivated European audiences with his portrayal of several Shakespearian roles. There is a theater on Howard University's campus that bears his name. Who is the actor?

11. Walk past Ira Aldridge Theater, down the steps, and make a left. As you walk past, there is a bench dedicated to the famous alumna, award winning author, and professor. Whose name is on the plaque?



12. As you pass the bench, you will approach the Fine Arts building on the left. It is named after an HU graduate who became an actor and was best known for his starring role in "The Black Panther".

13. She received her Bachelor of Fine Arts degree from Howard University. In 2004 she made history as the first African American woman to win a Tony Award. She played the role of Claire Huxtable, and attorney on "The Cosby Show". (Hint: Unscramble the letters to reveal the name.)
